## RE: Information Memo for Kings River-Hardwick Elementary School District

- Charter District CAASPP: Kings River-Hardwick scored higher than the county and state averages on the Spring 2017 CAASPP assessments at each grade level for both ELA and Math. The district's overall average percent of students scoring Met or Above standard in ELA was 70.61%. This is higher than the county at 42.37%, and state at 48.56%. In the area of Math, Kings River-Hardwick averaged 61.34%. The county averaged 29.18%, and state average was at 37.56%.

- 3. County Office Site Visit: The charter oversight team visited Kings River-Hardwick on November 3, 2017.
- 4. County Summary of District's Fall Dashboard: Kings River-Hardwick scored very low and maintained at 0% for suspension rate. Every student group maintained at 0%. Academics for ELA were high and declined by 8.6 points. The math rating was high and maintained. English Learner Progress was medium, but declined significantly by 31.1%. Overall, the district scored blue on suspension rate, green on both ELA and Math, and orange on English Learner Progress.
- 5. The Kings County Office of Education has no concerns, and has commendations for Kings River-Hardwick School. Kings River-Hardwick has a sincere and gracious feel. Tradition is well blended with innovation. Teachers are supported as they try new ideas and instructional techniques that promote the high standard expectations. Art and music were integrated into the curriculum as evidenced by classroom visits and student work. The focus on unit development was demonstrated as first graders were engaged in a science lesson that incorporated various learning modalities. Recently, a district from a nearby region has requested classroom visits based on the successes of this district in the area of Math.

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# Kings River-Hardwick Charter School District Annual Report on Academic Performance 2016-2017

## **Charter District Response:**

1.A CAASPP Performance and Fall Dashboard Results

The Kings River-Hardwick Charter School District, upon review of our overall academic performance on the CAASPP, believes the district performed well in comparison with comparable local districts, the county, and state. (*See data charts.*) The data received from this CAASPP administration has been used to set growth goals for increased performance of all students as well as significant subgroups. Through analysis of these performance results, we have identified areas of focus for continued growth in academic achievement, including areas for continued professional development.

The success we are most proud of upon review of the state and local dashboard indicators include our strong academic performance in ELA and Mathematics respectively. As the state dashboard indicates, we are a very high, green school in ELA and a high, green school in math, achieving a met or exceeded level of 71% in ELA and 61 % in Mathematics. In addition, our EL students performed well, achieving an overall met or exceed level of 44% in ELA and 30% in Math. Suspension and attendance are additional areas that stand out for our LEA with an overall suspension rate of 0% and attendance rate of 96.1% at P2 and chronic absenteeism rate of 6.6%. In all areas, we are performing well above the current state average.

However, that being said, one of the significant challenges we currently face is maintaining and increasing our current high level of performance. Although we are proud of our success thus far, we realize we are at a point where continuing our upward trajectory requires focused, prescriptive actions. Last year we were a very high blue school in ELA and a high blue school in math. However, just a few points of decline this past year impacted our overall rating significantly, even though we are still performing at a very high level.

The specific areas where our performance is of concern continues to be English Learner Progress in both ELA and Mathematics, as well as SED, SWD, and Hispanic student performance in Mathematics. In the area of English Learner Progress, we are currently orange according to the state accountability dashboard overall, as well as in ELA and Mathematics. Although we are not content with this rating, we should acknowledge that this is progress compared with the red indicator we received as an overall score last year. Our SED, SWD, and Hispanic populations achieved a yellow rating on this year's dashboard, highlighting the need for continued support to enhance growth for students in this area.

Kings River-Hardwick ensures 100% of parents participate in Parent/Teacher conferences in an effort to keep parents informed of their child's progress towards mastery of grade level standards. Parents also have input in programs and services through attendance at a minimum of 4-School Site Council meetings, 4- District English Learner Advisory Committee meetings, 5- Parent Booster Club meetings, and 10 District Board Meetings. Parents are also provided with opportunities to learn more about ways they may support their child's learning, through participation in parent workshops in the areas of reading and math. In addition, Kings River-Hardwick provides access to Spanish interpretation and translation services to allow parent/guardians to fully participate in educational programs and individual meetings. These services are provided by KRHSD employees such as site secretaries, bilingual instructional aides, and administrators.

- 1st-3rd Grade: Report card grades of "2" or higher in English (including embedded social science and science) and mathematics. 2016-17, 97% scored a "2" or higher in English and Mathematics. 100% received "Credit" in visual and performing arts, keyboarding, health/physical education. / \*4th-6th Grade: Report card grades of "2" or higher in English, mathematics, social science and science. Report card grade of "Credit" in visual and performing arts, keyboarding and health/physical education. In 2016-17, 96% scored a "2" or higher in English and Mathematics. 100% received "Credit" in visual and performing arts, keyboarding, health/physical education. / \*7th-8th Grade: Report card grades of "C" or better in English (including embedded CTE), mathematics, social science and science. Report card grade of "Credit" in foreign language, visual and performing arts, applied arts and health/physical education. In 2016-17, 95% scored a "C" or better in English (including embedded CTE), mathematics, social science and science.
- 4th-8th Grade CTE is also addressed during after school clubs. We offer a minimum of five after school clubs over 300 students participated. Transportation for participation in these clubs was provided two days per week.
