Kings River-Hardwick School District is focused on the need for each graduate to become productive, flexible adults with the appropriate skills to maintain lifelong learning in a diverse global environment.

STUDENT AGREEMENT

The success of our school is a reflection of the effort of every student. Students agree to:

1. Attend school on time daily for the entire instructional day. Strive for no more than 5 absences for the entire year
2. Come to school focused on learning and their education with a positive attitude
3. Complete all assigned work on time to the best of their ability
4. Demonstrate a high level of respect toward adults, other students, and themselves
5. Exhibit respect for school property and the property of others
6. Follow all school rules, including the discipline and dress code policies
7. Participate as a community member through community service, extra curricular activities and school community involvement
8. Attend intervention programs, such as after-school tutoring for 7th and 8th grade students, in order to raise low state test achievement scores and grades.
9. Participate in physical education, and other aspects of wellness

PARENT AGREEMENT

Supervision is the joint responsibility of the school and the parent, including:

1. Regular daily attendance is the foundation for academic growth. Parents will make all possible effort to ensure their child is at school on time every day for the entire instructional day, including the completion of any Independent Study contracts. Expect your child to achieve a 97% attendance rate, or no more than 5 days of absence for the year.
2. Recognition that academic success is the first priority for Seventh and Eighth grade students scoring Basic or below for English Language Arts and/ or Math on the California Standards Test who also have low classroom grades for the previous year will regularly attend after-school tutoring to improve their achievement record.
3. Complete support of the KRH discipline policy, dress code, and positive behavior expectations
4. Positive student behavior is strengthened by shared family and school support, including a focus on positive character traits and the accountability of each student to contribute their very best effort daily
5. Full partnership in student learning, including supervision and assistance with homework, test preparation and project planning, and research
6. Prompt and courteous communication with the school, with the teacher as the first point of communication
7. Participation in school events, such as Parent/Teacher Conferences, Back to School Night and Open House, School Performances, team and club activities, and PBC functions
8. Volunteering on a regular basis. Each parent is expected to provide a minimum of 5 hours of volunteer service each year. Calico Art Festival is the first priority for volunteering, as it is the largest school fundraising activity. Parents may also participate in: Parent Booster Club, School Site Council, Sports Events, Room Parents, Book Fairs,

Kings River-Hardwick School District

Enrollment Policy

Students who were enrolled in the Kings River-Hardwick Union Elementary School District at the time the District Charter was adopted (July 2001) have preference to attend Kings River-Hardwick School regardless of their place of residence.

Siblings of students who enrolled in the Kings River-Hardwick Union Elementary School District at the time the District Charter was adopted (July 2001) may also attend on the same basis as in the preceding paragraph, so long as the attending student is enrolled at the time the sibling applies for enrollment. If there is a break in enrollment, the siblings lose the preferential attendance status accorded to historical district residents.

Students who reside within the historical Kings River-Hardwick Union Elementary School District boundaries and began attending Kings River-Hardwick District School after July 2001 shall have preference to attend Kings River-Hardwick School. Students who cease to reside within the District's historical attendance area will maintain preferential attendance status.

The purpose of this policy is to protect the preferential rights of current residents of the historical Kings River-Hardwick Union Elementary School District.

Except as provided in this policy and District Regulation, attendance in Kings River-Hardwick Union Elementary School District will not be based upon the residence of the pupil or the pupil's family or guardian. However, if the number of pupils who wish to attend Kings River-Hardwick School exceeds the school's enrollment capacity, the District may limit attendance.

District capacity is established by the governing board and is currently as set forth in Schedule "A". Enrollment may be limited when the number of existing pupils exceeds 80% District capacity in any grade or class. Selection of pupils will be determined by public random lottery, if necessary, after accommodating pupils who reside within the District's historical residence boundaries. The District's governing board may grant other preferences that are consistent with the Charter School Law of 1989, as amended.

Notwithstanding any other paragraph of this section it is the policy of the District to allow the dependent children of employees to attend Kings River-Hardwick School. It is understood, however, that residents of the historic attendance area will not be displaced by this policy. It is also the policy of the district to allow students who attend the Kings River-Hardwick Pre School Program to attend in priority order.

The hierarchy of attendees is as follows: all students who live within the historical district boundaries; then in public random lottery in descending order: 1. Employees' children; 2. Siblings of current enrollees; 3. Children attending KRH Pre-School programs; 4. All others as space allows.

Charter Enrollment Capacity Regulation

The Kings River-Hardwick Union Elementary School District established an optimum school size of 800 students. Whenever District pupil enrollment reaches 80% for grades 4-8 and 80% for grades TK-3 of District capacity, the District superintendent may implement the District policy for limiting enrollment, as follows:

1. Determine the needs of District residents and grant precedence for those students.
2. Determine whether any pupil space remains after granting the preferences described in 1 above.
3. If the superintendent determines that there is additional pupil space, he or she will post and publish a schedule for conducting a public lottery at least 30 days before the end of the current academic year.
4. Participants in the lottery will include pupils on the District waiting list.
5. The District will notify successful lottery participants within 30 days of the date the lottery is conducted.





Dear Mr. Sheldon,

Under the provisions of Education Code this office must review and based on its review, either approve, conditionally approve, or disapprove the budgets of school districts within Kings County. The following code sections are important to this process:

E.C. 42127(a) requires school districts to adopt a budget on or before July 1 of each year and submit it to the county superintendent within five days of adoption or by July 1, whichever occurs first.

E.C. 42127(c)(1) requires the county superintendent to examine the adopted budget for compliance of State adopted Standards and Criteria for the purpose of identifying technical corrections necessary to bring the budget into compliance if it is not.

E.C. 42127 requires the county superintendent to determine whether the adopted budget will allow the district to meet its financial obligations during the fiscal year.

Our analysis must now include, under AB 2756, any reports or studies that show signs of fiscal distress.

From our analysis, based on the district budget reports and projections provided, we conclude that;

- The district has met the criteria and standards
- The district will meet its financial obligations in the current year and two subsequent years based on the district's multi-year projection.

Based on our analysis and review, we approve the adopted budget of the district. Subsequent to the district's approval of the 2013-14 Adopted Budget, the funding structure for state aid allocations has changed dramatically with the passage of AB97. Over the next few months, the education community must assess the budget impact of these changes on an individual basis. Our office will continue to provide guidance throughout this process. While our office has considered these changes during our budget review process, we anticipate reviewing the full impact of this change with the district's First Interim Financial Report due to our office on December 16, 2013.

We have noted from information provided to the County Office of Education that negotiations have not been settled for your certificated and classified bargaining unit for the 2013-2014 Fiscal Year. State regulations require a school district to determine the cost of salary settlements with certificated and/or classified bargaining units and provide County Offices of Education with an analysis of the costs when negotiations are completed. The Governing Board must certify as to the validity of the analysis. The Superintendent and Chief Business Official are required to certify the district's ability to fund the agreement. We ask that your business office submit the analysis, disclosures, and certifications as required.

This letter is to express the Kings County Office of Education's support for the charter renewal of the Kings River Hardwick Union School District (KRHUSD). The KRHUSD (Charter# D1) originally was chartered January 2001, subsequently received renewals in 2004, and received the last renewal in 2009.

Education Code Section 47607 states that commencing on January 1, 2005, or after a charter school has been in operation for four years, whichever is later, a charter school's charter may not be renewed unless specific performance standards have been met.

The Kings River Hardwick Union School District has met these performance standards. The Charter has maintained above average Academic Performance Index (API) scores for all its schools as presented in their 2012-2013 Accountability Report Cards.

In addition to achieving a high academic standard, the KRHUSD has enjoyed a history of strong fiscal management. The Charter has received "Positive" certifications for each of its Interim Reports in the last five years. The District's 2013-2014 First Interim Budget reflected a 14% unrestricted and designated for economic uncertainties reserves for the current fiscal year and projects keeping reserves above 14% for the two subsequent years.

Based upon the County Superintendent of Schools' review of the Charter's financial reports in accordance with State Criteria and Standards as prescribed by AB 1200 and subsequent legislation, the Kings River Hardwick Union School District can meet its required fiscal responsibilities.

Annual Report to the Governing Board

In the most recent review of accomplishments, challenges and recommendations, Charter staff found the following to be true:

1. Students attending Kings River-Hardwick Elementary School District continue to excel academically with these STAR results from Spring, 2013 testing (see Attachment F):
 - a. API 874
 - b. Numerically Significant Subgroups: Hispanic/Latino- API 838, White- API 891, and Socioeconomically Disadvantaged- API 820.
 - c. Not in PI status
2. KR-H students, including numerically significant subgroups, did well on 2010-11 and 2011-12 STAR results, with an API score of 843 in 2010-11, an API of 878 in 2011-12 and meeting all AYP targets both years, exiting program improvement (see Attachment G).
3. In comparison to the two Kings County schools most like Kings River-Hardwick (Pioneer Elementary/Middle Schools and Kit Carson Elementary School) our students scored favorably on STAR testing (see Attachment H).
4. Approximately 40% of the 750 students currently enrolled in the Charter are interdistrict transfer students. Our P2 attendance rate was 97% in 2013.
5. In the history of the Charter, no student has transferred out of the Charter under Element XII (Attendance Alternative).
6. The Charter effectively utilizes flexible assignment of staff, placing classified staff in non-academic support programs when necessary.
7. The Charter maintains strong support programs for At-Risk students (RSP, Title I, EL, Migrant Tutoring, CAHSEE Counseling).
8. The Charter continues to maintain Art, Music, PE and Keyboarding positions
9. The Charter maintains a strong student activities component both during and after school.
10. The Charter is proud of the unusually strong and effective parent-involvement program here at KR-H.


