Re: Description of Changes to the Audeo II Charter Petition Necessary to Reflect the State Board of Education as the Authorizing Entity

Dear Director Chan and Ms. Hall:

The Audeo II Charter School ("Audeo II") charter petition was denied by the Carlsbad Unified School District Board of Trustees ("District" or "CUSD") on January 20, 2016. The Petitioners appealed the District's denial to the San Diego County Board of Education ("County"), and the County Board voted to deny the charter on March 9, 2016.

Audeo II respectfully submits its charter petition to the State Board of Education ("SBE"). In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 11967(b)(4), we have listed below the relevant and appropriate changes to the charter petition that are necessary to reflect approval by the SBE:

1. Chartering Authority

Any text referring to the "Carlsbad Unified School District," "CUSD," or the "District" as the chartering authority shall be revised to read "State Board of Education" or "SBE," or the "California Department of Education" or "CDE" as the oversight agency, where appropriate.

2. Petition Element N: Dispute Resolution (p. 113)

Audeo II recognizes that the SBE may choose to resolve a dispute directly instead of pursuing the dispute resolution process specified in the charter, provided that if the SBE intends to resolve a dispute directly instead of pursuing the dispute resolution process specified in the charter, it must first hold a public hearing to consider arguments for and

against the direct resolution of the dispute instead of pursuing the dispute resolution process specified in the charter.

Further, Audeo II recognizes that if the substance of a dispute is a matter that could result in the taking of appropriate action, including, but not limited to, revocation of the charter in accordance with Education Code Section 47604.5, the matter will be addressed at the SBE's discretion in accordance with that provision of law and any regulations pertaining thereto.


3. Technical Amendments
