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- CSU will continue to accept CAASPP results in English language arts/literacy and mathematics as EAP statuses.
- Participating community colleges vary in their use.
 - High schools should check the following to determine local practices:

- **Achievement Standards interpreted to EAP**
 - Standard Exceeded – Ready
 - Standard Met – Conditionally Ready
 - Standard Nearly Met – Not Yet Ready
 - Standard Not Met – Not Ready
- CSU does **NOT** use Claim Scores

- **Standard Exceeded – Ready for college-level coursework in English/mathematics**
 - Student does not need to take the CSU's English and/or mathematics placement exams (exempt).
 - May enroll directly in college credit-bearing courses.
 - CSU's Early Start program not required (exempt).

- **Standard Nearly Met – Not yet ready**
- **Standard Not Met – Not ready**
 - Must take CSU's English and/or math placement tests.
 - Likely required to participate in CSU's Early Start.



- **Standard Met – Conditionally Ready for college-level coursework in English/mathematics**
 - Student does not need to take the CSU's English and/or math placement exams. However...
 - Student must participate in CSU's Early Start program, **UNLESS**
 - **Student participated in an approved senior year course and earned a grade of C or higher, or met the condition through another pathway. If so, then...**
 - Student may enroll directly in college credit-bearing courses.
 - As determined by the campus where the student enrolls.

Approved Courses for Conditionally Ready Students

- Students may use approved English and math courses to meet EAP conditional status (Achievement Level 3)
 - English: ERWC, AP, IB, Honors (UC approved)
 - Math: courses with Alg. II or IM III as a prerequisite
- CA Standards math sequences adopted through the UC A-G Course Management Portal are also acceptable
- CSU is in the process of developing a 4th year math course similar to the ERWC





Grade 11 — Early Assessment Program (EAP) Status

The California State University (CSU) and participating California Community Colleges (CCCs) will use the ELA and mathematics assessments of the CAASPP System to determine Bella's 2018 EAP status, which will provide an indicator of Bella's predicted readiness to take college-level English and mathematics courses when Bella begins college.

The CAASPP overall score and achievement level for ELA and mathematics shown on the front of this report can be used to provide an early indicator of Bella's readiness for college-level coursework, as described below:


- **Standard Exceeded:** Ready for English and/or mathematics college-level coursework.
- **Standard Met:** Conditionally Ready for English and/or mathematics college-level coursework. Students earning a status of Conditionally Ready (Standard Met) can be exempt from the CSU's placement test and the Early Start Program by taking an approved senior year course and earning a grade of C or better.
- **Standard Nearly Met:** Not yet demonstrating readiness for English and/or mathematics college-level coursework.
- **Standard Not Met:** Not demonstrating readiness for English and/or mathematics college-level coursework.


Reporting

- Students must release results to the CSU and participating California Community Colleges (CCC) for data to be available electronically to CSU and CCC campuses.
- Non-released results to CSU or participating CCC must be provided directly to the campus by the student (Individual Student Score Report)
- Results on Transcripts: This is a district decision.




The Early Assessment Program (EAP) Will Help You Be Prepared!

The EAP helps students determine their readiness to take college level English and math courses before attending a California State University (CSU), or one of the participating California Community Colleges (CCC).

What Makes a Course "College Level"?
Students who demonstrate readiness for college level courses have the English and math skills necessary to succeed without the need for developmental coursework. The credits you earn in these courses count towards college degree requirements.

How Do Students Participate in EAP?
All 11th graders will participate in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) in English Language Arts/Literacy and mathematics. Your EAP results are included on the CAASPP Individual Student Score Report provided by your high school. Your score report will provide an indicator of your readiness to take college level courses. EAP results are not used to submit your results at a later date.

How Will Colleges Know If You Are "College Ready"?
Let your EAP results count by releasing them to the California State University or California Community Colleges. Simply mark the release button at the end of the test. It's that easy! If you do not mark the release button, you will be required to submit your results at a later date.

What Else Can You Do to Determine If You Are "College Ready"?
Take the SAT or ACT in the 11th grade as an additional way to determine if you are ready for college level courses in English Language Arts and mathematics. We encourage you to register to take the test(s) in the spring of your junior year.

what do the results mean?

EAP results provide an early indicator of your readiness to take college level courses. Knowing and understanding your EAP status and overall CAASPP scores will give you the opportunity to improve your skills during your senior year.

EAP Statuses

"Ready"
(Standard Exceeded)

You may enroll directly in CSU college level English and/or math courses. Exempt from taking required CSU English and/or math placement tests (EPT/ELM) and from participating in the CSU Early Start Program.

"Conditionally Ready"
(Standard Met)

You must take an approved senior year-long English and/or math course and pass with a grade of "C" or better in both semesters. Exempt from taking required CSU EPT/ELM and may be exempt from participating in the CSU Early Start Program.

"Not Yet Ready"
(Standard Nearly Met)

or
"Not Ready"
(Standard Not Met)

You must take the required CSU EPT/ELM. May be required to participate in the CSU Early Start Program unless you meet other Early Start Program exemptions.


