Ready to continue your education at a community college, university, or technical school?
Want to get into the work force?
The CHSPE exam could open up a variety of options for you.
This site will educate you about the CHSPE and provide registration information and instructions for taking the test in your area.

CHSPE is a test for students who need to verify high school level skills. In some cases, students take the test and leave high school early to work or attend college. Those who pass the test receive a Certificate of Proficiency from the State Board of Education, which is equal by law to a California high school diploma.

People who are 16 years of age or older may take the test. Younger people who meet other criteria can also take the test. There is a fee to take the test. This test is given twice each year at many sites in California.

PHYSICAL FITNESS TESTING (PFT)

The physical fitness test (PFT) for students in California schools is the FITNESSGRAM®. The main goal of the test is to help students in starting life-long habits of regular physical activity.

Students in grades five, seven, and nine take the fitness test. The test has six parts that show a level of fitness that offer a degree of defense against diseases that come from inactivity. The test results can be used by students, teachers, and parents.



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
