Why Do We Administer the Initial Alternate ELPAC?

The Initial Alternate ELPAC identifies students who need help learning English. Because students who take this test may communicate in different ways, students may use preferred communication modes such as gesture, eye gaze, or an Augmentative and Alternate Communication (AAC) device to respond to receptive (listening and reading) and expressive (speaking and writing) items. Students who are determined to be an English learner (EL) will receive extra help learning English.
