




Graduation Rates Rising and Absenteeism Declining

- California's **graduation rate** continues to make steady, modest progress and is now at its highest rate of **87.5 percent**, up 4.8 percentage points since 2017.
- The rate of **chronic absenteeism** for all students continues to improve. The 2025 statewide rate of **19.4 percent** represents an improvement of more than 10 percentage points from an all-time high of 30 percent in 2022.

Enrollment Trends Shifting

- The overall decline in public school enrollment has begun to slow in several regions. New initiatives such as Transitional Kindergarten are driving growth and signs of promise.
