

Graduation Rate Indicator

On the California School Dashboard (Dashboard), comprehensive (or traditional) high schools and Dashboard Alternative School Status (DASS) schools receive a combined four- and five-year graduation rate for the Graduation Rate Indicator. This rate is based on the number of high school students who graduate with a regular high school diploma in either four or five years. The 2023 Graduation Rate Indicator includes students from the most recent graduation cohort (Class of 2023) as well as students from the prior cohort (Class of 2022) who graduated in their fifth year of high school in 2022–23.

Note: Only students who receive a regular high school diploma are counted as graduates. Students who earn a Special Education Certificate of Completion, a California High School Equivalency Certificate, an adult education diploma, or pass the California High School Proficiency Examination are included as non-graduates. Results will fall into one of five levels, ranging from “Very High” to “Very Low.”

Comparing Current and Prior Year Data

We compare current and prior year data to determine whether a school or district made improvement (i.e., had a higher rate of graduation in 2023 than it did in 2022) or experienced a decline.

Results will fall into one of five levels, ranging from “Increased Significantly” to “Declined Significantly.”
