This letter is written for clarification and in response to requested information regarding the changes necessary for a material revision to our current Prepa Tec Los Angeles High Charter.

Prepa Tec Los Angeles High has established that a change from a proposed enrollment target of 168 students per grade level to 130 students per grade level is necessary. This was ascertained from the success of past extensive recruitment efforts that continues to garner a current interest of approximately 130-150 students for incoming freshman. In order to facilitate a successful program, it was decided that we should continue our recruitment efforts with a lower capacity target number that would still access appropriate ADA to meet the needs of the high school program yet alleviate the need to readjust the program that was originally designed to facilitate.

As the City Council of Huntington Park has voted in a two year moratorium of granting permits for facility construction for charter schools, and in order to best facilitate the successful delivery of our IBMYP program, Prepa Tec has opted to take advantage of a Prop 39 offer from LAUSD for our incoming Freshman class at Huntington Park High School which is located at 6020 Miles Ave, Huntington Park, CA 90255 within a ½ mile of our current site, thus serving the same demographic area.

Alta Public Schools has retained and renovated a turnkey facility in our bordering community of Bell located at 4210 E Gage Ave, Bell, CA 90201 to host the Prepa Tec Los Angeles High Sophomore class for the 2017-2018 school year.

The PTLAHS Board of Directors has not yet approved the submission of a material revision, but it is anticipated that this action will take place on June 20, 2017. Attached is the Board agenda that has been posted for public record. The Draft of the minutes for this meeting will follow to demonstrate the Board's action.

PTLAHS will provide the Board agenda and minutes reflecting that the Board has previously taken action to correct the petition language regarding graduation requirement for PE which was not in the original petition.
