Alta Vista Community Charter School's (AVCCS) education program includes a classroom-based program as well as homeschool and hybrid options allowing students to receive instruction in a nonclassroom-based setting. The hybrid option, which included instruction in a classroom setting 3 days per week and at home 2 days per week, was previously managed as Independent Study. After the pandemic and students returned to in-person instruction, the applicable Independent Study laws prohibited Independent Study to exceed 20% of a classroom-based student's time in school. Therefore, the hybrid option became unavailable to students. AVCCS intends to offer this option again to its students but will manage it as a nonclassroom-based program. Since AVCCS anticipates that the Charter School's nonclassroom-based ADA will exceed 20% of its total ADA with the hybrid and homeschool portions of its educational program, AVCCS seeks a funding determination that allows it to exceed the 20% limit.
