However, the Charter leadership and staff remained open and fluid with their mission to maintain continuity of education for their students. In addition to receiving substantial amounts of one-time funding appropriations from the Federal and State governments during a funding determination year, the Charter executed their plan to maximize their resources to address the student's social-emotional health, physical safety, and technology needs while meeting their spending criteria. Additionally, they are in process of a facilities project that will span three fiscal years, 2022/23, 2023/2024, and end in 2024/25. Besides the reserve percent set aside for the facilities project all other unassigned balances will be used to meet the student's needs as the Charter continues to grow and
