1. Explain why the charter school did not meet the criteria for the funding level requested. Include specific measures or actions taken by the charter school to comply.

Maidu did not meet the criteria for the funding level requested due to the following:

- 1) Due to the lingering COVID issues during the 21/22 school year, opportunities to fund staff professional development, conferences, etc were reduced. The lingering issues included the slow return of in-person conferences as many vendors and speakers were still hesitant to participate.
- 2) We were unsuccessful in our attempt to fill a high-cost replacement for a dual enrollment social science position. If we had been able to replace this position, we would have met our 80% spending criteria as the salary for this position is approximately \$120,000. This position will be reposted in the spring of 2023 for the 23/24 school year.
- 3) There were also challenges filling part-time teaching positions.
- 2. List and explain the mitigating circumstance(s) to be considered by the CDE and ACCS.

Maidu Virtual Charter Academy plans on expensing the Federal and State one time restricted funds of \$33,077 over the next two years to provide additional support to students by

- 1) Providing extra hourly teacher support for student-tutoring
- 2) Provide extra instruction during the summer allowing students to rectify incompletes they received over the last two years.

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3. Provide any other pertinent information that may assist the CDE and ACCS in conducting a detailed review or develop a reasonable basis for a recommendation.

Even though we were unable to fill part-time positions in the 21/22 school year, we did fill a couple in the 22/23 school year. We added a 0.25 Assistant Principal, part-time Mental Health and Special Education Support, and Summer School staff (two teachers, counselor and principal).

We are also purchasing Hot Spots for student who do not have or have limited access to the Internet, and new educator laptops to support virtual teaching.

Conferences are opening up now, and we will have staff attending several this spring among them will be the California Charter Schools Conference, and the California Charter Authorizing Professionals Conference.
