Section VI. Mitigating Circumstances (Complete lines 1-3 and attach any supporting documentation)

1. Explain why the charter school did not meet the criteria for the funding level requested. Include specific measures or actions taken by the charter school to comply.

Student hours attended by the NCB pupils at the school site declined significantly due to COVID, severely impacting the amount of facilities costs which could be considered as part of the percent spent on instruction and related Services to total revenues. Buellton's 2019-20 FDF shows 20,600 student hours attended by the NCB pupils at the school site, whereas this submission shows just 335 hours. Pre-COVID, OGCS students were required to be at the center at least once per week, and most students spent much more time onsite than the minimum required. Since COVID, we no longer require students to be onsite for any period of time, and many of our students now very rarely set foot in the center though we are maintaining roughly the same square footage.

Not only did COVID impact our students' onsite hours, but there was a significant decline in enrollment. Buellton had less than half as many students enrolled in 21-22 as compared to 18-19.

2. List and explain the mitigating circumstance(s) to be considered by the CDE and ACCS.

Both student hours in facilities due to COVID and declining enrollment impacted the LEA's ability to meet the 80% target.

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3. Provide any other pertinent information that may assist the CDE and ACCS in conducting a detailed review or develop a reasonable basis for a recommendation.

A thorough facilities assessment took place in the fall of 2022 with a detailed report out at the 12/15/22 Board meeting, outlining the release of certain facilities as lease terms come due. Lowering the facility burden Buellton carries will help the LEA more closely approach the 80% threshold, as will efforts to encourage students to return to the centers, resulting in a higher level of student hours logged in facilities.
