As a hybrid program, Valley Oak offers 4 days of on-site programming to students who homeschool through our Independent Studies program. We provide classes, workshops, testing, resources, supervision and socialization opportunities to this unique community. For the past 20 years, we have been providing public school support and guidance to those who would otherwise be outside the public school setting. In order to provide stability to these students, Valley Oak limited our daily expenditures to provide the funding to secure a 4.5 acre property. The majority of the monies listed in reserves comes from the depreciation of this property. School closures limited our daily expenditures as well as our students were not able to utilize any services on site.

2. List and explain the mitigating circumstance(s) to be considered by the CDE and ACCS.

Our enrollment is limited under the terms of our charter to no more than 75 students total, spanning grades TK-12. This means that our annual budget is equally small. As enrollment has decreased across the Ojai Valley, Valley Oak is working to maintain our program now and in the future. Paying off the property became a more urgent goal as enrollment projections continue to fall. Our goal is to have our property paid in full in the next two years, and to do this, it is important that we continue to stretch our funding to ensure that our students have a home in the future. As we discuss solutions to the enrollment projections before it affects our ongoing budget, our Board of Directors supported a focused effort on securing our property.
