Connecting Waters, East Bay satisfied both the Certificated Salaries and Benefits and Instruction/Related Services funding determination percentages when the One-Time revenues were removed (please see below). Each student was provided generous instructional budgets to be used in support of their unique and specialized needs. However, due to the lingering effects of the pandemic, teacher shortages and issues finding workers the school was unable to meet the Instruction/Related Services test of 80%.

2. List and explain the mitigating circumstance(s) to be considered by the CDE and ACCS.

\$127,338 - other one-time revenues recognized in FY 2021-22 that affect the revenue/expenditure ratio that would not be a factor in other years: Educator Effectiveness - \$116,538 and A-G Grants - \$10,800.

If the school had not recognized these one-time revenues, the Calculated Funding Determination Percentage would be 43.97% / 81.06%.
