Section VI. Mitigating Circumstances (Complete lines 1-3 and attach any supporting documentation)

1. Explain why the charter school did not meet the criteria for the funding level requested. Include specific measures or actions taken by the charter school to comply.

Fusion Charter did not quite meet the 100% recommendation due to a Line V.2 of 77.84%, compared to an SB740 qualification of 80% for Instruction Related Services. We request that Fusion be considered for the full 100% funding because the 2021-2022 school year, on which our determination is based, was an atypical year, with very low student attendance on campus, Line B.2.f(ii). Low ADA-based revenues were due to the extreme absences resulting from the continued pandemic and required quarantines, which were disproportionately severe for Fusion's low-income at-risk demographic. For the 2022-2023 school year, Fusion has increased student opportunities in person on campus, with hands-on electives, intensive math tutoring, and transportation assistance, and has already seen an increase in ADA from 71.93 at Spring 2022 P2 to 87.14 at Fall 2022 P1. Prior to the pandemic, Fusion's 2019 P2 was much higher at 99.29, a number we anticipate exceeding in future years with improved on-campus attendance.

- 2. List and explain the mitigating circumstance(s) to be considered by the CDE and ACCS.
- 1. In 2021-2022, reduced ADA revenues available to offset facility costs coincided with increased facility use by a larger number of staff working from the facility to provide one-on-one support. Fusion staff work from campus and meet students both in person and remotely, including calling all students with absences.

 2. In 2021-2022 facility maintenance expenses, including increased sanitation, were much higher than before the pandemic, with a Line B.2.e of \$196,754 compared to \$138,156 in the previous funding determination form four years ago.
- 3. In 2021-2022, Fusion served a cumulative 201 students, including 57 graduates and only six dropouts.
- 4. In 2022-2023 and beyond as the impact of the pandemic continues, Fusion will need full 100% funding to serve the on-campus needs of vulnerable students with extreme learning loss from three years of academic and social disruptions, compounding a lifetime of poverty and school disengagement.

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- 3. Provide any other pertinent information that may assist the CDE and ACCS in conducting a detailed review or develop a reasonable basis for a recommendation.
- 1. Fusion has Dashboard Alternative School Status (DASS) due to the high proportion of students (more than 70%) who enter the school with credit deficiency and other high-risk factors and are in need of individualized attention and a low pupil to teacher ratio. This level of service requires 100% funding.
- 2. Line B.3.c(ii) Supervisor Oversight Fee of 1% for 2021-22 was not billed by authorizing district TUSD until the fiscal year had ended. This mandatory fee was paid in December 2022.
- 3. During the pandemic, (as of 8/1/2020) Fusion discontinued back office services from an outside provider and in-house staff assumed all state and federal reporting responsibilities. This cost-cutting decision reduced expenses by \$48,000 annually which was diverted to instructional uses instead of adding to the expense on Line B.3.c(iii) non-instructional operating cost. Fusion staff anticipate continuing to complete all reports in-house in the future in order to preserve funds for instructional use.
