Director Farland,

This letter is to describe the changes to the OnePurpose School renewal petition on appeal to the State Board of Education (SBE). Toward that end, OnePurpose suggests the following technical amendments:

- Replacement of “San Francisco Unified School District” and “SFUSD” with “State Board of Education” and “SBE” respectively. It should be noted that to the greatest degree possible, OnePurpose used the term “Authorizer” throughout the petition to limit the need for these changes upon appeal.
- Addition of the following Assurances to the list on pages 15 - 21, to reiterate compliance with Education Code (compliance is demonstrated in the charter text as well). Should the SBE wish to have additional assurances added, OnePurpose is amenable.
  - *Will maintain a section in its employee code of conduct on employee interactions with pupils; provide written copy of the section to parents/guardians at beginning of each school year; and post the section or provide a link to it on the school website in compliance with Education Code 44050.*
  - *Will provide guaranteed and free enrollment in any ASES programs to homeless and foster youth and inform the parent or caregiver of this right in compliance with Education Code 8482.6, 8483, 8483.1 & 8483.5.*
  - *Will provide services for homeless and foster students as required under Education Code 48850 et seq.*
  - *Will not enter into agreements that would prevent mandatory reporting of egregious misconduct, or expunge or enter into an agreement authorizing expunging an employee’s personnel file in compliance with Education Code 44939.5.*
- Should the SBE desire, the Measurable Pupil Outcomes listed in Element B for OnePurpose students “Overall and for all Numerically Significant Subgroups” can be listed individually by subgroup as well. OnePurpose holds the same growth goals for each subgroup as it does for the overall population, as detailed in the charter. As OnePurpose is a small school, numerically significant subgroups are expected to

change in the next charter term (currently only the Socio Economically Disadvantaged and African American subgroups have 11 or more students in grades 3 and above).

We look forward to the opportunity to be heard in front of the Advisory Commission on Charter Schools (ACCS) on February 5th and to be heard by the full Board during its March 11th and 12th session. Most importantly, we look forward to many more years of bringing quality education to the families in the Bayview community and of San Francisco.
