

"What's new in state law?"

AB 49 requires this school's officials and employees, to the extent practicable, to request valid identification of any officer or employee of an agency conducting immigration enforcement seeking to enter nonpublic areas of this school, including bus drop-off areas when school-provided transportation is present.

Per **AB 49**, an officer or employee of an agency conducting immigration enforcement cannot enter this school without a valid judicial warrant, judicial subpoena, or court order.

SB 98 requires this school to update its comprehensive school safety plan to include communication if there is confirmed presence of immigration enforcement on the school site.
