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Announcements

First LTEL CoP Meeting Held May 23, 2023

The CDE MSD, with support from Sobrato Philanthropies and technical assistance from the Center to Support Excellence in Teaching at the Stanford Graduate School of Education, established a CoP grounded in the English Learner (EL) Roadmap Policy focused on understanding the research and local data surrounding LTELs. The LTEL CoP will meet over 24 months and held its first meeting virtually on May 23, 2023.

Over the next two years, the CoP participants will collect and analyze qualitative and quantitative data to better understand students identified as LTELs and design supports around their specific needs. This work will include expanding definitions of data and examining local data (including LTEL course taking, A–G completion, shadowing, observations, etc.) in novel ways through a design thinking and liberatory design framework. Dr. Laurie Olsen, author of *Reparable Harm: Fulfilling the Unkept Promise of Educational Opportunity for California's Long Term English Learners*, will contribute to the CoP planning and will document the CoP's learnings, process, and recommendations following the conclusion of the CoP.

Assessment

TK ELPAC Administration

There have been many questions from local educational agencies (LEAs) regarding the administration of the ELPAC to TK students following the TK expansion to include 4-year-olds by 2025–26 as a result of California *Education Code* (*EC*) Section 48000(c)(1)(G). Per *EC* Section 48000(d), LEAs are required to administer the ELPAC to eligible students in kindergarten—including year one of a two-year kindergarten program, also referred to as TK—through grade twelve.

In collaboration with the Assessment Development and Administration Division, Early Education Division, and the MSD, the CDE has determined federal and state law requires LEAs to administer the ELPAC to all eligible TK students. Therefore, the CDE must continue to require LEAs to administer the ELPAC to all eligible TK students as required by law. This decision continues to support students' rights to receive EL programs and services if identified as an EL student. Therefore, LEAs will continue to follow the same process for identifying and annually assessing EL students.

For 2023–24, the enrollment process for an LEA will not change. It is only when a student is enrolled in TK, the TK grade level will be transformed into kindergarten during the nightly California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System feed to the Test Operations Management System (TOMS). These students will appear in TOMS as kindergarten but will have the TK indicator flag set to Y (Yes), which will allow LEAs to locally track their students through the various reports and downloadable student data files available in TOMS.

We are continuing to determine the most appropriate path forward regarding English language proficiency assessment of this population of TK students and will keep you updated with any new information.

New Alternate Assessment Decision Making Worksheet

The CDE is pleased to announce the release of our new Alternate Assessment Decision Making Worksheet available as a PDF at

https://www.cde.ca.gov/ta/tg/ca/documents/altassessmentdecision.pdf. Designed to guide and support individualized education program (IEP) teams with a step-by-step

process to determine whether a student is most appropriately assessed with an alternate assessment, the CDE's Assessment Development and Administration Division developed this new Alternate Assessment Decision-Making Tool after consulting with the CDE's Special Education Division.

Using this tool, the IEP team determines an individual student's eligibility to participate exclusively in alternate assessments. Throughout the tool, IEP teams must review multiple sources of information, including the student's IEP and other data, such as results from formative assessments, evidence-based interventions, assistive technology assessment, and the student's cumulative folder documenting supports and services. This tool can also be used as documentation for the IEP process.

Literacy

Research Study on Reading Comprehension Supplement for Grades 4 and 5

Researchers at Texas A&M University have developed a comprehensive reading comprehension intervention called Knowledge Acquisition and Transformation Expansion (KATE). KATE pairs professional supports for teachers with a web-based tutoring platform to improve reading instruction and student comprehension.

This program has been extensively researched, with four studies reviewed by the What Works Clearinghouse showing that KATE had strong positive effects on reading comprehension. Studies show that 4th and 5th grade students had gains in general reading comprehension, students' main idea generation, and summarization skills. This study is funded by ED's Education's Education Innovation Research (EIR) Expansion Grant and seeks to offer KATE to a more diverse and nationally representative sample.

WestEd and Texas A&M are seeking school district participants to pilot the program during the 2023-24 school year at no cost and participate in the research study.

Benefits to participating in this study include:

- Free access to the KATE tutoring software (uses Chrome browser)
- Contains Spanish-language supports
- Appropriate for EL students and students receiving special education services
- Free teacher professional development
- Two days of practice-based professional development, including practice and connections to the schools' curricula materials
- Coaching support for classroom implementation
- Teachers will receive \$1,000 for study activities
