## Performance Level Descriptors

ELPAC Level	What Students Can Typically Do at Each Level
<p><b>LEVEL 4</b></p>	<p>Students at this level have <b>well developed</b> English skills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They can usually use English to learn new things in school and to interact in social situations.</li> <li>• They may occasionally need help using English.</li> </ul>
<p><b>LEVEL 3</b></p>	<p>Students at this level have <b>moderately developed</b> English skills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They can sometimes use English to learn new things in school and to interact in social situations.</li> <li>• They may need help using English to communicate on less-familiar school topics and in less-familiar social situations.</li> </ul>
<p><b>LEVEL 2</b></p>	<p>Students at this level have <b>somewhat developed</b> English skills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They usually need help using English to learn new things at school and to interact in social situations.</li> <li>• They can often use English for simple communication.</li> </ul>
<p><b>LEVEL 1</b></p>	<p>Students at this level are at a <b>beginning stage</b> of developing English skills.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They usually need substantial help using English to learn new things at school and to interact in social situations.</li> <li>• They may know some English words and phrases.</li> </ul>
