

What Data Will Be Used for the 2022 Dashboard?

Beginning with the 2022 California School Dashboard (Dashboard), federal and state requirements to hold schools and local educational agencies (LEAs) accountable for student outcomes is being restarted. Because Assembly Bill 130 (AB 130) restricts the California Department of Education (CDE) to only use 2021–22 school year performance data, the **2022 Dashboard will only display Status data** for each applicable state indicator. Note that Change (i.e., the difference from prior year data) and performance level colors will not be reported on the 2022 Dashboard due to the restrictions imposed by AB 130.

“Reporting Status only” signifies that each LEA, school, and student group will receive one of five Status levels (Very High, High, Medium, Low, and Very Low) for each applicable state indicator. The table below identifies the data that will be used to calculate Status. Note that these data will be published to the 2022 Dashboard by the CDE and that all indicators use the most current data available.
